Multi-Family Townhouse : Bedford - Stuyvesant

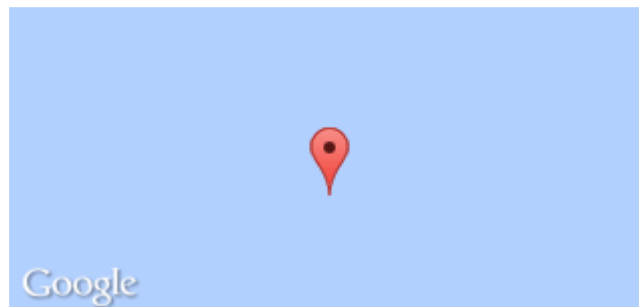
Just steps from Saratoga Square Park 728A Macon Street was built around 1895 and designed in a very free version of the late Romanesque Revival style. This special two family Redstone home has many original details such as stained glass, wood staircase, pocket shutters, pocket doors, Queen Anne moldings and five original decorative Minton tiled surround wood mantles. As you walk on the beautiful plank wood flooring you will notice the custom cabinetry, plaster ceilings, waist-high wainscoting, encaustic tiles, and bluestone paving in the rear. Yet the home also boasts such contemporary features such as a center-island kitchen with new modern appliances, updated bathrooms and all-new mechanicals. Both units of this house have open floor plates rarely found in boxy Victorian brownstones. This layout allows for easy modern living inside and out and would be perfect for anyone who enjoys entertaining. An enclave of distinctive Victorian apartments and townhomes the proposed Stuyvesant East section of Bedford Stuyvesant has maintained the historic integrity of the late nineteenth century. This house sits on a tranquil block with mature flowering trees rivaling the Brooklyn Botanic Garden which creates a park-like setting for a special Brooklyn residence.
